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This motif measures approximately 2 ½ inches (6 cm) in diameter when worked in size 20 crochet/tatting thread

Requirements


Size 20 thread, a tatting shuttle, crochet hook and a small pair of scissors


Abbreviations

R = ring, p = picot, cl = close ring, RW = reverse work (turn up side down), CH = chain

Row 1

Wind about a meter of thread onto your shuttle and Do not cut from the ball





Repeat from * to ** 3 times (4 rings and 4 chains) Fig 5

3, p, 3 (Fig 4) RW**

Cut and tie to the base of ring 'A' then secure the ends.


Row 2



Wind about 3 metres of thread on your shuttle. Do not cut from the ball

R F 8, + to the picot on one of the rings on Row 1, 8, cl (see Fig 6), RW

CH 2, (p, 2) 7 times (see Fig 7) pull up the chain to curve as in the diagram and photograph







R G 8, + to the same picot on row 1 as for ring F, (see fig 8) 8, cl, RW

CH

2, (p, 2) 5 times (see Fig 9), pull up the stitches so that the chain curves as in the diagram and Photograph, RW



Repeat from the start of the row, joining to the adjacent ring on the first row (see Fig 10 and photograph)



Omit the RW after the final chain then cut and tie to the base of the first ring on this row. Secure the ends.
